### THE COMMUNITY

Scappoose School District is a small rural school district in Scappoose, Oregon located approximately 20 miles northwest of Portland, Oregon along the Columbia River. Our community benefits from the resources and opportunities that are available in both Multnomah and Washington County. Scappoose School District provides a personalized and challenging education for our students. Our school district consists of one high school, one middle school, and three elementary schools utilizing a K-3, 4-6, 7-8, and 9-12 grade level configuration.

### THE SCHOOL

Scappoose High School is a comprehensive, 4-year public high school that serves approximately 760 students. Our student body is talented, energetic, and involved. They are a reflection of our strong extracurricular programs at Scappoose, including a large and competitive athletic program, and 15 school clubs and associations. Scappoose has a strong and committed faculty, built on a rich tradition of excellence in instruction.

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## SCHOOL ORGANIZATION

- Scappoose operates on a Semester Schedule; six classes, 60 minutes, 5 days per week. Each semester runs for 15 weeks.
- Two *"J-Terms"* are implemented at the conclusion of each semester. Each "J-Term" runs for 3 weeks; three classes, 105 minutes, 5 days per week.
- Each semester course will earn .5 credit. Each "J-term" course will earn .25 credit.
- Class rank is based on all subjects taken, weighted and unweighted.

## **GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS**

Scappoose students are required to earn a minimum of 24 credits (0.5 credit for each semester course and 0.25 credit for each J-term course successfully passed), during grades 9 through 12. Courses required for graduation are as follows: Language Arts 4.0, Applied/Visual/Technical Arts 3.0 credits, Social Studies 3.0 credits, Physical Education 1.0 credit, Science 3.0 credits, Health Education 1.0 credit, Mathematics 3.0 credits, and Electives 6.0 credits.

## CURRICULUM

Scappoose High School offers a comprehensive selection of courses in the areas of Business Education, Mathematics, Visual & Technical Arts, Language Arts, Science, and Social Science. Students may challenge themselves by enrolling in Advanced Placement, Willamette Promise, and dual credit courses. A wide variety of rigorous elective courses will be offered during "J-term."
